Minutes of the Annual General Meeting

Held on Saturday 7th March 2020 at All Saints, Emberton

1) Chairman's Welcome

Martin Petchey welcomed 40 members of the Branch, representing 16 towers, and Ruth Groves, Guild Representative to the meeting.

2) <u>In Memoriam</u>

Barry Eglesfield shared memories of John White who died this week. He lived in Towcester and rang at Easton Neston. Barry ask members to note the peal board in the Emberton tower recording a double peal of minor in which John took part. All present stood in quiet remembrance of this much loved and respected ringer.

5) Annual Reports and Accounts.

These two reports were presented and approved separately. Both were proposed for adoption by Graham Bartholomew and seconded by Alan Marchbank. There were no matters arising.

6) <u>Election of New Members.</u> The following nomination forms were received. Those with an asterisk were present at the meeting and apologies were received from the rest of the nominees. The Chairman proposed en bloc their adoption as Members and welcomed them to the Guild. The proposal was unanimously carried.

7) Election of Officers

The existing Officers had advised that they are available for election, except Patricia Rosewell, who has decided to take a sabbatical to deal with family responsibilities. There were no other nominations and Alan Marchbank proposed en bloc and Graham Bartholomew seconded the election of the following Officers. This was approved unanimously.

It was noted that Janet Bond attends Officers Meeting to help improve links with the Western Towers.

8) Election of Independent Examiner

Peter Green had advised his availability to continue in this role. Alan Marchbank proposed and Graham Bartholomew seconded this. It was unanimously approved.

9) Bell Fund Grant Applications

A request from Stoke Goldington for a grant towards the estimated cost of £900 to rebush their clappers was proposed by Doug Hird and seconded by Alan Marchbank. The current Branch rules offer a minimum grant of £50 plus 1% of cost of the work to a maximum of £450.00. The sum agreed for this grant is £100 and this was agreed unanimously. The Officers were asked to have another look at the Branch policy.

Alan Marchbank explained the latest situation whereby the Hanslope project has met a situation whereby there is some essential specialist welding required, at a cost of £15,000, not foreseen in

the original proposal. He asked the tower to provide the Secretary with a report with a view to a further review of branch grants available.

10) Any Other Business

Diary. The Secretary presented the current programme in the agenda bundle. He confirmed that the Diary is available on the branch website and this can be downloaded and printed to be used in each tower. _ The Ringing Master presented a list of changes and highlighted the following items below. Safeguarding Policy. The Secretary advised that a detailed multipage policy has been published by the Guild <u>http://odg.org.uk/safeguarding/</u> He read out some examples of the duties of those involved in training vulnerable children and the requirement for the Tower Captain, as an Officer of the Church, to conform with Church policy and DBS registration. He was asked to establish the Guild contact for this topic and publish this and a copy of the policy on the branch website and to all Towers.

VE Day arrangements. The Chairman asked if all Towers in the MK Borough would let him know of ringing arrangements planned for 7.00pm on 8th May so that these arrangements can be included in MK event publicity. If possible QPs would be good.

Ringing World Pathways 2020. The Chair asked if any member needed more information or support to this initiative please let him know.

2020 Heritage Days. The Chair advised of the intention to include information about and demonstrations of ringing activity in selected towers in conjunction with the national heritage events in September, He asked towers to advise him of their local plans and he will publish more detailed plans in due course.
